

# MCCCD TRANSFER ADVISING GUIDE

## NORTHERN ARIZONA UNIVERSITY ATHLETIC TRAINING B.S.

### 2008-2009 Catalog Year

Students who intend to transfer to NAU for an Athletic Training B.S. degree may use this guide to complete an Associate in Art Degree at a Maricopa Community College while including courses needed for the major. This is not a specific Athletic Training degree from MCCCD and does not guarantee admission into the NAU program. See the reverse for more information.

The Associate in Arts degree is designed for students who plan to transfer to four-year colleges and universities. In general, the components of the degree meet requirements for majors in the Liberal Arts. The degree will transfer as a block without loss of credit to Arizona's public universities and other institutions with district-wide articulation agreements. Semester credits used to satisfy the AA degree will apply to university graduation requirements of the university major for which the AA is designed.

This guide is for students who would like to meet the requirements to apply to the NAU Athletic Training Education Program while completing an Associate in Art Degree at a Maricopa Community College. It is not a specific Athletic Training degree and does not guarantee admission into NAU's program.

Students should contact their college's Athletic Trainer to begin their athletic training experience while in Community College to meet the experience requirement to apply to NAU.

## Northern Arizona University Program Information

The Extended B.S. in Athletic Training at Northern Arizona University will prepare students to sit for the National Athletic Training Association Board of Certification examination.

**Admission to the Athletic Training Education Program (ATEP) is highly competitive.** Admission decisions are based on the coursework you've completed, your grade point average (2.75 minimum), your experience in athletic training (minimum of 80 observation hours under a Certified Athletic Trainer, ATC, and completion of EXS 190 with a "C" or better - OR - 1 year under an ATC), your letter of application, letters of recommendation, an interview, a practical examination, and proof of CPR for the Professional Rescuer and First Aid Certification.

Students applying for admission must have completed a minimum of two semesters of college-level coursework (or in progress) including the following courses or their equivalents with a grade of C or better: AT 200, PSY 101, BIO 181 and 181L, and HS 200. Students who have completed at least four semesters of college-level coursework (or in progress) must have also completed BIO 201, BIO 202, HS 229, NTS 256, and CHM 151 and 151L.

Upon admission, we require that you have a physical exam by a physician of your choice; show proof of immunization for hepatitis B, measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, and diphtheria; and attest that you meet the technical standards established by our program and by NAU's Disability Support Services.

### Transfer Admission Policy

If you are a transfer student, you must submit a completed application to the Athletic Training Education Program. With your application, you must also submit syllabi for any courses previously taken that are required for NAU's B.S. in Athletic Training. Our faculty then reviews your transcripts and syllabi to determine course equivalencies and clinical experiences and to ensure that you meet all competencies.
